ACTION 3

MENTAL HEALTH AND WELLBEING DECLARATION

In order to think about how we can all help to realise the right to mental health support for every child and young person, as a class/group you can create a Mental Health and Wellbeing Declaration. This will outline how and why mental health should be a focus in your school, group or organisation.

We have provided a <u>template</u> for children to use after a class/group discussion on the topic. Instructions on how to complete the declaration are included in the template.

Before completing the template, discuss the following with children:

- Why is children's mental health important?
- What can cause poor mental health?
- What resources are available within the club or school that support mental health?
- How do they feel, when they feel good about their mental health?

- What commitments can the class/group members make to take care of their own mental health as well as looking out for others' mental health?
- What changes do they suggest for the school, club or organisation that would improve children's mental health, so everyone feels safe to talk about how they feel, and can access the support they need?

Before the activity, please also share this <u>letter</u> with parents and carers so they are clear about the activity.

If you're running OutRight in a school or college, perhaps your class representative could take the declaration to a School Council meeting, to ensure that a whole school declaration – if they make one – is informed by children right across the school.
